

Pupil Premium Plan for 2014/2015

We have received for this academic year the figure of £16900.

To be broken down as follows:-

Staffing	Including teaching and support staff salaries, intervention training	11400.00
Supplies and Services	E.g. Pupil Tracker online, Abacus maths	4000.00
Meals/Fruit	Provision of fruit/Meals for pupils not receiving free school meals.	500.00
Educational Visits	Residential trip subsidy, educational visits and visitors, enrichment activities, clubs.	1000.00

We intend to continue the successful one to one/small group intervention programme for targeted individuals and to invest in additional teaching support materials and training in literacy and numeracy.

We use an online tracking system to measure progress and attainment. This means that we can enter data and use the online tool to help us see where we need to provide extra help for individuals and groups of children. We will also use some funding to ensure all children, whatever their background, can access the extended curriculum e.g. funding for trips and after school or Breakfast Club.

We recognise that a good diet can help children's development and are funding the provision of fruit to all school children at break time. We have set up a Breakfast Club which we are offering free to all pupil premium pupils. Pupils who receive pupil premium but are no longer entitled to free school meals are offered a hot school lunch.

In the Early Years Foundation Stage (Reception), 100% of pupil premium pupils achieved expected progress at the end of their first year with us.

At the end of Year 6 (Summer 2014) out of a cohort of eight, two pupils were eligible for free school meals – their combined achievement of 100% 2 levels progress in Reading, and writing was higher than the National Average for similar pupils.
